A Pastoral Letter from Pastor Eun Young Ko

Greetings in Jesus Christ,

Do you know that the first official day of fall was on September 23rd? It means that we are living in fall now, even though it seems we are still experiencing some quite warm days. Harvest season is coming, but farmers in Illinois are not happy about the unideal circumstances. We ask God, "Why do these bad things happen to good people?" and, "Is it true that God is suffering with those who are suffering for many reasons such as loss, sorrow, pain, and desperation?"

Recently, I met one of Halla's friends' mom, who is a faithful Catholic. While we were chatting, she told me that Catholics pray for what they need to certain saints - not to God directly. Someone seeking a career change needs to pray to St. Joseph, who is the earthly father for Jesus. He is the patron of people such as: cabinetmakers, carpenters and craftsmen, confectioners, the dying, engineers, families, fathers, workers, house hunters, people in doubt, and travelers. Her parents, who are house hunting, pray to St. Joseph, too. She continued saying, "We pray to St. Joseph because he is a human being, so he can understand all human beings concerns or struggles."

While I was listening to her, I was able to see how much human beings have a desperate need for an understanding of their vulnerability, suffering, and problems that need to be solved on this earth. I, as a pastor of the United Methodist Church, was also reminded of our Lord, Jesus Christ who was incarnated and became a human being. Jesus Christ was willing to take all of our sins and carry them on the cross to suffer for us and save us.

"(...) Though he was in the form of God, he did not consider being equal with God something to exploit. But he emptied himself by taking the form of a slave and by becoming like human beings. When he found himself in the form of a human, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore, God highly honored him and gave him a name above all names. (Philippians 2:6-9)"

Giving up all the authority Jesus Christ had, and being humble enough to understand our suffering, pains, and hardships; symbolizes His constant and consistent love for us. In this season of fall and harvest, I hope and pray that you know Jesus Christ came to the earth for us to fully understand who we are, what kinds of suffering and struggles we are dealing with, and what hardships we are going through. You are not the only one who faces those things in your life. Jesus Christ is willing to be with us and stretch out His arms holding us, giving us rest for our soul.

I can't wait to witness how God will comfort, lead, and solve problems for us and our human concerns or hardships in the coming fall and harvest season in our lives. Let us be bold to share our testimony which is counted by the blessings we are given.

Book Discussion Group Monday, October 14, at 7:30 p.m. "The Personal History of Rachel Dupree" by Ann Weisgarder



FINANCIAL CHALLENGE

If God sent bills, we would never get out of debt to Him. Truly, our debt to Him is beyond measuring! His blessings are beyond our comprehension if we simply take the time to consider. For healing. For shelter and our homes. For the new life of a newborn child. For our jobs. For our food and clothing. For our freedom. For our church and church family. God has promised to provide all our needs (Philippians 4:19), not our wants and desires, but our needs. On second thought, maybe we'd learn to be more thankful if God did send bills. At least we'd be forced to wade through the limitless stockpile of His blessings. As we commit our lives to Him, we acknowledge our complete dependence on His blessings. We recognize that our dedicated life becomes the only repayment we can give in return. A Christian is "always in debt" to God for all he or she has or is.

As we begin the last quarter of 2019, we find ourselves with a \$13,000 deficit for the year through August. There are exactly 13 weeks left in this calendar year. Therefore, in order to make up and eliminate this deficit Faith Church needs to receive an additional \$1000 each week for the next thirteen weeks, above and beyond meeting our normal budgeted expenses. That may seem like an insurmountable request, but we must remember that God will provide if we are faithful to Him. We can only do the ministry that God funds, so it is incumbent on all of us to be mindful and in prayer concerning how He wishes each of us to support this challenge.
